IMPORTANT NOTICE

Starting on July 1, 2025, Minnesota will require boaters under 21 years of age to obtain a watercraft operator's permit to operate any motorized watercraft including boats, pontoons, or jet skis. This requirement will gradually extend to all people born after June 30, 1987 by 2028, and the permit can be obtained through an online safety course for a fee of \$34.95. Due to recent heavy rainfall, Kandiyohi County Commissioners issued a No Wake

Restriction within 150 ft of the shoreline. This restriction will expire June 25th, but if we continue to receive large amounts of rain, they will enact it again. 

Hand drawn ideas would need more work to transfer to clothing/embroider so


will be rewarded by receiving a "free" printed t-shirt or the equivalent off of any other apparel order you may want. Let's get those creative designs started!

2025 Carp Update The lake association has been working with commercial fisherman Jason George to remove the rough fish again this year. Jason has done the rough fish removal the past two years. This year has been different from other years. With the depth of the

ice this year, the water stayed cooler longer this spring. The carp and buffalo did not

school up early this spring like years past. When the water warmed up and the fish finally began to school, we received large amounts of rain in June. With the extensive amount of water coming into Eagle Lake from Halvorson slough, it was impossible to set nets and remove them. Our lake levels rose almost 14 inches from June 1st to June 16th! The water levels began to recede the week of June 16th. We are hoping to begin the removal process before the July 4th weekend. The board would like to say "Thank You" to all those that donated to the carp removal fund. Your support has been amazing! We will keep everyone up-to-date, once we are able to net and remove the rough fish. Trail Update The restoration of the walking path to the Eagle Lake dam has reached completion. This achievement was made possible through the placement of 48 yards of gravel,

delivered in four truckloads of 12 yards each. Two skid steers and eight volunteers

contributed significantly to the project's success. We would like to express our
